## What is the CAP?

### A framework for measuring, planning and reducing greenhouse gas emissions (GHGs) from County-owned assets and unincorporated areas

#### **Two-Phased Approach**

- 1. Preliminary CAP
- 2. Comprehensive CAP with California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Analysis


### **Sector Goals**

**Energy** Improve green building standards, retrofit existing buildings using sustainable materials and appliances, expand renewable energy sources and improve energy efficient infrastructure

Enhance public transit networks (including rail), increase electric vehicle use, reduce single occupancy vehicle use and promote cycling and walking

**Env. Justice** Increase urban green spaces, expand access to transportation and promote green workforce development



NaturalImplement water conservation practices, improve water management efficiency,Resourcesenhance stormwater management and protect natural habitats



**Resilience** Support coastal resilience plans, mitigate water resource vulnerabilities, improve hazard and disaster health order response, and harden critical infrastructure against earthquakes



## **Economic Co-Benefits**

**Jobs** – Increase employment opportunities and expand workforce training and transition to green industries

**Cost Savings** – Save on utilities through energy efficiency, transition to renewable energy sources and micro-grid expansion

**Revenue** – Sell captured landfill gas as new revenue source

**Funding** – Increase grant competitiveness with a qualified CAP that has been certified under CEQA

- Seek approval from the County Board of Supervisors

Supervisor Foley and Supervisor Sarmiento host the County's first Climate Resiliency Hearing	August 2023
County Hires its first Sustainability Officer	February 2024
Develop Preliminary CAP	In Progress
Host Series of District-Based Public Forums	In Progress
Finalize Greenhouse Gas Inventory, Establish Reduction Goals, and Incorporate Public Feedback into the Preliminary CAP	July 2024
Host Public Forum to Review Draft of Preliminary CAP	August 2024
Finalize Preliminary CAP	August 2024
Seek County Board of Supervisor's Approval of Preliminary CAP	September 2024
Initiate CEQA Analysis and Certification Process for CAP	September 2024
Public CEQA Workshops & Seek County Board of Supervisor's Approval of CEQA Certified CAP	Fall 2025
